DAHA - The Year Ahead.

DAHA are very excited for the year ahead. Since we launched **4** years ago we have been working to place domestic abuse firmly on the housing agenda. The introduction of the **Make a Stand Pledge** as part of Alison Inman's CIH presidential theme of domestic abuse, continued by this year's president (Jim Strang) has cemented domestic abuse as a housing issue where we can make a real difference to the lives of our customers.

With 2 women a week dying at the hands of a partner or former partner there is a real need to build on the momentum of Make a Stand and for the Regulator of Social Housing to introduce a **requirement** to **recognise and respond to domestic abuse aS** part of the Consumer Standards. The year ahead will see us continuing to make this case.

Whilst the social housing sector has a crucial role to play, it is only one part of the change that is needed. We are working with key players across the housing and domestic abuse sectors to promote a 'whole housing' approach to domestic abuse whereby:

- There is a full suite of housing options for survivors of domestic abuse which can provide for the long-term security of the survivor, as well as managing short term crisis situations.
- There is supply of genuinely affordable accommodation.
- There is sufficient secure move on accommodation.
- Agencies are encouraged and incentivised to work in partnership to identify and support survivors.
